- Leading guided tours of the property in English and/or other European languages (45-60 minutes long). Full training will be given.
- Working in a small team with other guides to deliver guided tours to large groups
- Promoting upcoming events and activities to visitors
- Providing directions and guidance to visitors (including other attractions within the Borders)
- Giving support to the Room Stewarding team and the Visitor Services team as required
- Promoting excellent customer service

- An ability to lead tours in other languages in addition to English is desirable, but not essential.

- Strong visitor focus
- An interest in and willingness to develop own knowledge of Abbotsford, Sir Walter Scott and the Borders.
- Able to work as part of a diverse team
- Able to deal with the little changes to our plans that working with visitors often brings
- Be patient, understanding, have a responsible attitude and provide exceptional visitor focus.
- A curiosity about Abbotsford and a desire to support the work of the Trust
